# **CT Community College Nursing Program Fall 2021**

The Connecticut Community College Nursing Program (CT-CCNP) is an Associate in Science Degree Nursing Program offered at six Connecticut Community Colleges: Capital, Gateway, Naugatuck Valley, Northwestern, Norwalk, and Three Rivers. Graduates are eligible to take the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) and can apply for licensure through the Connecticut State Board of Examiners for Nursing. ### **Application Process:**

The application period for the Fall 2021 semester start is November 1, 2020 through February 1, 2021. Students are encouraged to apply early even if some of the admission requirements are in progress, provided the requirements will be completed by February 1, 2021. Submit the following to the Admissions Office at the **College of Choice\*\*** by the **February 1st deadline date**:

Connecticut Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) seeking admission to the CT-CCNP follow the same application process and must meet the same admission requirements as all other applicants. Availability of LPN Advanced Placement (LPN bridge option) is based upon space and other resources for both Traditional and Fast Track options. If accepted to the CT-CCNP and offered an "advanced placement" option, LPN students would begin in NUR 220 upon successful completion of the bridge option.

- <u>Nursing courses</u> must be completed in the designated sequence. <u>General Education courses</u> must be completed, with minimum "C" grade in the semester indicated above or may be taken earlier. (Anatomy & Physiology I & II require "C+" minimum grade.)
- Some admission and/or program requirements may be met through AP (Advanced Placement) exams, CLEP (College Level Examination Program) exams, Accuplacer Assessment Test, SAT/ACT scores, and/or institutional credit-by-exam tests.
- Nursing Program application process, admission requirements, and/or curriculum may change without notice.
